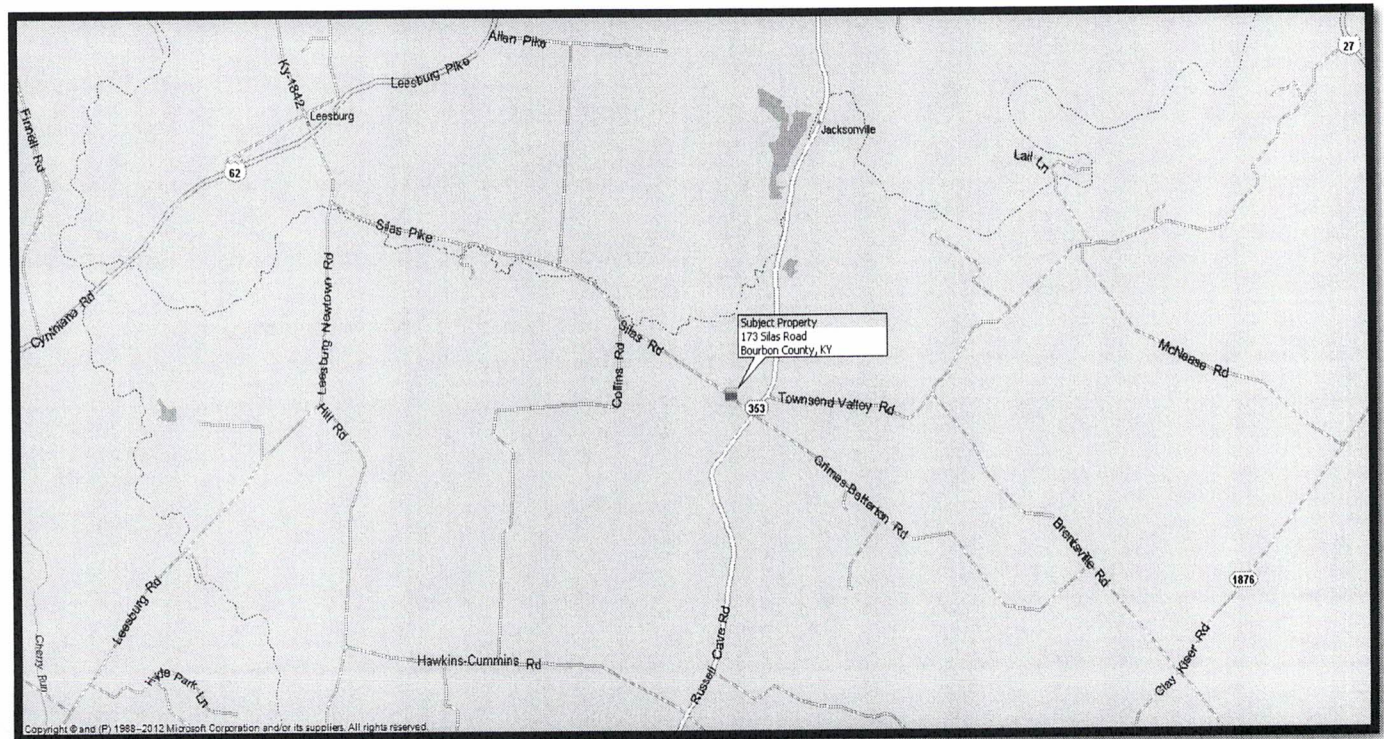
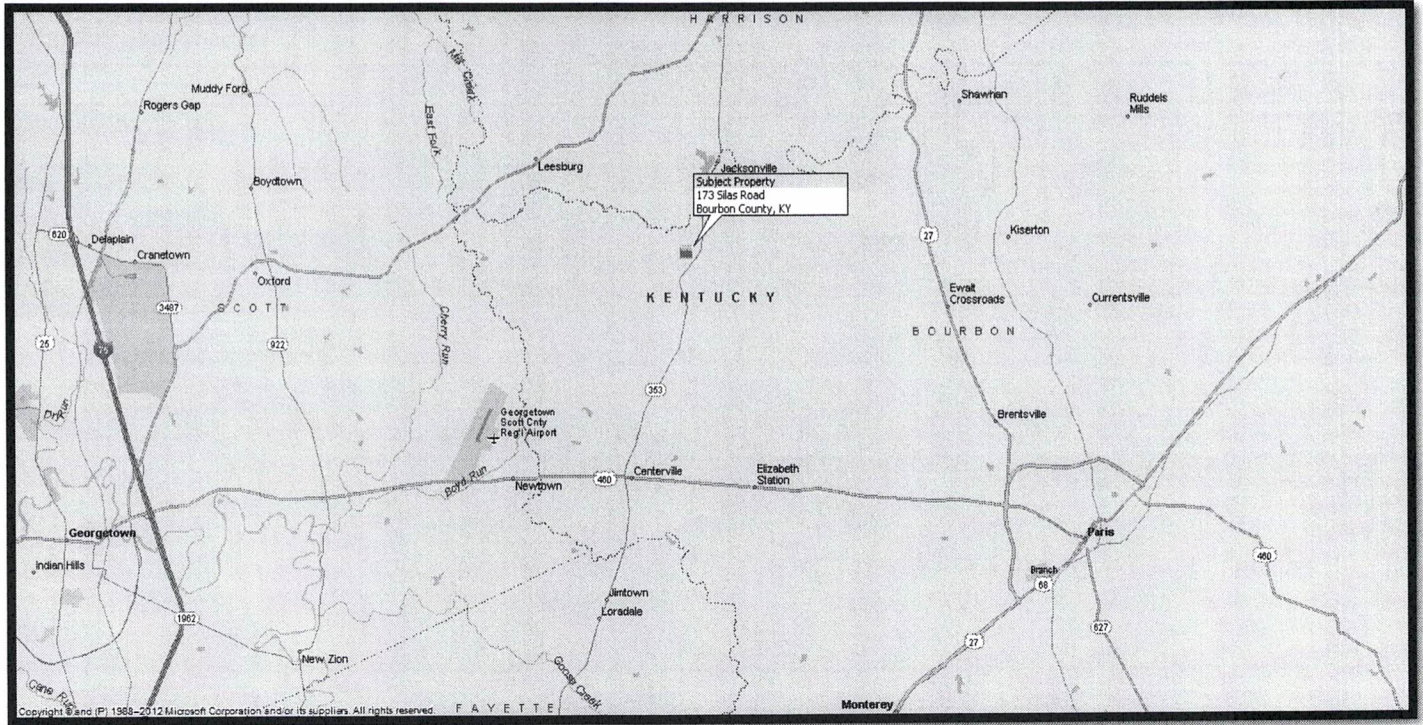

## Transportation Routes

Major roadways serving Bourbon County are U.S. 460, U.S. 27, and U.S. 68, which are all “AAA” rated highways. Additionally there are several state and county roadways serving the county. Interstate 75 is located 16 miles west of Paris and I-64 is 15 miles southwest. U.S. 27 was widened to a four-lane divided highway between Lexington and Paris approximately 15 years ago and is a significant enhancement to the transportation routes in the area. The Paris Bypass also provides access around the western side of the city. Overall the highway transportation routes are considered average to good.

Main Line Rail service is provided by CSX Transportation and by TransKentucky Transportation Railroad, a connecting line between Paris and Maysville. The nearest scheduled commercial air service is in Lexington, Louisville, and Cincinnati. Overall transportation is considered average for Bourbon County.
