Example Ground Rules for Reaching Consensus:

All draft items shall take into consideration the perspectives of the community (qualitative) and data and statistics (quantitative).

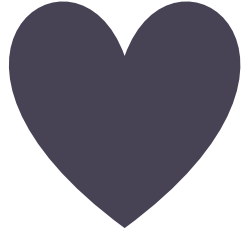

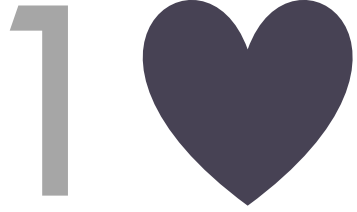

Create conversations on health.

Promote after-hours childcare events.

Increase availability to second shift childcare.

Improve recreational facilities, programs, and staffing.

Create small urban parks.

Participate in 10-minute walk program.





Consider health impacts in all policy creation.

Consider Health Impacts

Develop policy to address alternate modes of transportation.

Engage residents from diverse backgrounds in policy development.

Advocate for indoor, smoke-free workplaces.

Promote training for first responders and health care providers.

Inventory alternative transportation services.

Hold meetings in accessible locations.

Ensure development only occurs to sanitary sewer.

Improve air and water quality.

Ensure all developments are accessible to public safety services.

Educate on Substance Use Disorder

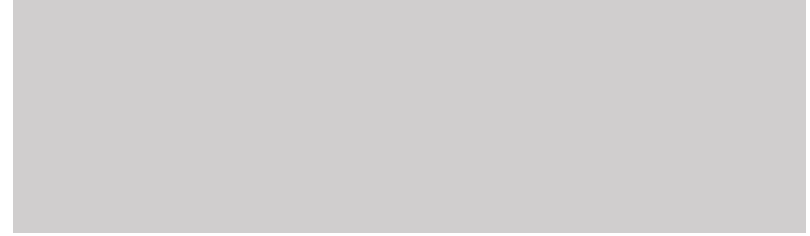
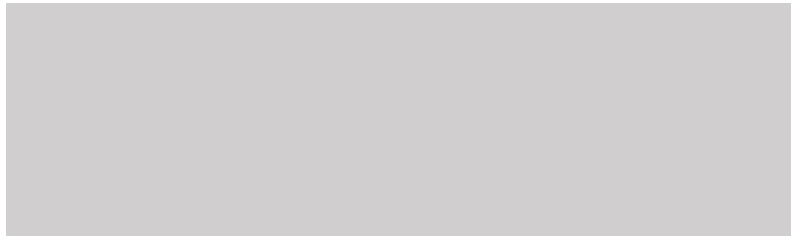
Implement prevention program in grade schools.
