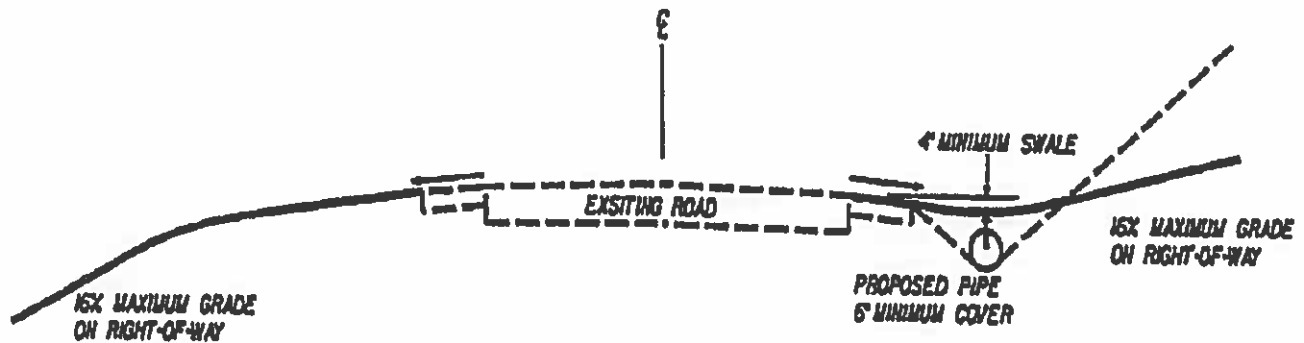
The centerline of the approved entrance is located approximately 0.726 mile south of Silas Road (CR 1319) (MP 4.029)

The entrance must be constructed so that the water drains away from the road and into the ditch, as shown in the diagram below. If pipe isn't needed and/or there isn't a ditch, the entrance must still drain away from the roadway.

APPLICATION FOR ENCROACHMENT PERMIT

10. The requested encroachment shall not infringe on the frontage rights of an abutting owner without their written consent as hereinafter described. Each abutting owner shall express their consent, which shall be binding on their successors and assigns, by the submission of a notarized statement as follows, "I (we), _____, hereby consent to the granting of the permit requested by the applicant along Route _____, which permit does affect frontage rights along my (our) adjacent real property." By signature(s) _____, subscribed and sworn by _____, on this date _____.
11. The permit, if approved, is subject to the agreement that it shall not interfere with any similar rights or permit(s) previously granted to any other party, except as otherwise provided by law.
12. Permittee shall include documentation which describes the facilities to be constructed. Permittee, its successors and assigns, agree as a condition of the granting of the permit to construct and maintain any and all permitted facilities or other encroachments in strict accordance with the submitted and approved permit documentation and the policies and procedures of the Department. Permittee, its successors and assigns, shall not use facilities authorized herein in any manner contrary to that prescribed by the approved permit. Only normal usage as contemplated by the parties and by this application and routine maintenance are authorized by the permit.
13. Permittee, its successors and assigns, at all times from the date permitted work is commenced until such time as all permitted facilities or other encroachments are removed from the right-of-way and the right-of-way restored, shall defend, protect, indemnify and save harmless the Department from any and all liability claims and demands arising out of the work, encroachment, maintenance, or other undertaking by the permittee, its successors and assigns, related or undertaken pursuant to the granted permit, due to any claimed act or omission by the permittee, its servants, agents, employees, or contractors. This provision shall not inure to the benefit of any third party nor operate to enlarge any liability of the Department beyond that existing at common law or otherwise if this right to indemnity did not exist.
14. Upon a violation of any provision of the permit, or otherwise in its reasonable discretion, the Department may require additional action by the permittee, its successors and assigns, up to and including the removal of the encroachment and restoration of the right-of-way. In the event additional actions required by the Department under the permit are not undertaken as ordered and within a reasonable time, the Department may in its discretion cause those or other additional corrective actions to be undertaken and the Department shall recover the reasonable costs of those corrective actions from the permittee, its successors and assigns.
15. Permittee, its successors and assigns, shall use the encroachment premises in compliance with all requirements of federal law and regulation, including those imposed pursuant to Title VI of the Civil Right Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. § 2000d et seq.) and the related regulations of the U.S. Department of Transportation in Title 49 C.F.R. Part 21, all as amended.
16. Permittee, its successors and assigns, agree that if the Department determines it is necessary for the facilities or other encroachment authorized by the permit to be removed, relocated or reconstructed in connection with the reconstruction, relocation or improvement of a highway, the Department may revoke permission for the encroachment to remain under the permit and may order its removal, relocation or reconstruction by the permittee, its successors and assigns, at the expense of the permittee, except where the Department is required by law to pay any or all of those costs.

KYTC-District 7 Private Permit Process

Definition

An entrance that serves a field, farm, or a single family residence. This type entrance is often referred to as a private entrance, farm entrance, field entrance, and/or residential entrance.

Permit Process and Applicant Responsibilities

1. Applicant must complete the left side of the Permit Application, Form 99-1(A), with their current mailing address and contact information.
2. Applicant must complete the attached Entrance Diagram Sheet. The address of the proposed entrance, addresses of the nearest driveways, and state road name/number are required. Any other information, such as landmarks and distances, can be added to the diagram sheet. This sheet is available at the KYTC District 7 Permit Office, State Maintenance Garages, or by emailing RobertA.Baker@ky.gov, MikeD.Stone@ky.gov, or John Terry@ky.gov.
3. Applicant must stake or mark the centerline of the proposed entrance. Please note how the entrance is marked on the Entrance Diagram Sheet (stake, ribbon, paint, etc.).
4. KYTC personnel will review the proposed entrance location for approval based on current standards of Access Management and Sight Distance.
5. If the proposed entrance does not meet current KYTC requirements, it will be relocated, if possible, along the property owner's road frontage. A meeting between KYTC personnel and the property owner will be arranged at this time. If there is not an acceptable location for the proposed entrance, the permit application will be denied.
6. If the proposed entrance location is acceptable, the applicant will receive documents stating the permit application is approved from the KYTC D-7 Permits Office. The Permittee will be responsible for contacting the State Maintenance Garage where the entrance is located. Please see Form D7-18. The Permittee is responsible for cutting trees, brush, and/or grass to ensure adequate sight distance prior to entrance construction and maintaining it thereafter.

Installation Details

KYTC Maintenance personnel may install an approved entrance. A pipe, if needed, must be furnished by the Permittee. It must be a minimum of 15" X 28' Corrugated Metal Pipe (CMP) or Reinforced Concrete Pipe (RCP). The pipe diameter may need to be larger if deemed necessary for proper drainage. KYTC will provide rock and/or millings as needed on current right of way. The amount of rock and/or millings will be determined in the field by KYTC Maintenance personnel in the county where the entrance is located. Installation of the entrance must be coordinated with the local State Maintenance personnel and is subject to their availability.
